#### 6. Future Collaborative activities

The Centre for Modern Indian Studies (CMIS-UC) was established in September 2010, in the University of Cologne. German Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF) within the initiative "A New Passage to India" funds the project to University of Cologne through the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). The four Indian University partners to the University of Cologne for the above project are Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Pondicherry University, Gandhigram Rural Institute and Vellore Institute of Technology. In the initial step, from TNAU, I have been invited as Guest Professor for a period of six months under the above program.

Subsequently, the following future collaborative activities during this year are proposed. These activities are fully financed by University of Cologne through DAAD. Follow up actions to these future activities will be undertaken by the Department of Agricultural and Rural Management, TNAU after the approval of Vice Chancellor of TNAU.

- ➤ Training of 2 Ph.D. scholars of the Department of Agricultural and Rural Management, TNAU for a period of 3 months at University of Cologne. (Mr. M. Chandrakumar, Assistant Professor and Ph.D. scholar is already deputed by TNAU and attending this training now. One more Assistant Professor (Ph. D scholar) is also approved to be trained at Germany)
- > Training of one MBA student of TNAU at University of Cologne for a period of three months

- > Exposure visit of three MBA students from TNAU to University of Cologne for a period of two weeks during this year under the Student Exchange Activities.
- ➤ Visit of one Professor from University of Cologne to TNAU during this year for a period of two weeks to offer special lectures and seminars for Management students.
- Visit of one German research scholar to TNAU for a period of three months during this year

Besides, the current project, funded by DAAD, does not provide any further funding for pure research activities to be carried out. However, few research areas, namely Skill Development through Non-formal mode of training, Demand for skilled work force in rural areas etc. have been identified. Suitable project proposals will be submitted to National (Germany and India) Governments and other international agencies for providing financial assistance for conducting the research in these emerging areas.
